	<p>Herpes type 1 can be transmitted from mouth to mouth</p> <p>Don't kiss someone with active herpes sores, "cold sores" or "fever blisters"</p>			<p>Some STDs are transmitted through skin to skin contact (herpes, HPV, syphilis)</p>	<p>Herpes type 1 & syphilis can be transmitted from mouth to genitals, (and vice versa). Other STDs can be transmitted to throat.</p>	<p>Fluid exchange and skin to skin contact increases risk. Use condoms!</p> <p>Hepatitis-A risk from Oral-Anal contact</p>	<p>Rectum tears easily, exposing blood. Use condoms & lots of lube to significantly reduce risk.</p>
<p>HUGGING, TOUCHING OVER CLOTHES, TOUCHING, RUBBING, "DRY HUMPING"</p>	<p>KISSING</p>	<p>TOUCHING EACH OTHER UNDER CLOTHES (NOT GENITALS)</p>	<p>TOUCHING EACH OTHERS GENITALS UNDER CLOTHES</p> <p>MUTUAL MASTUR-BATION</p>	<p>RUBBING YOUR GENITALS AGAINST ANOTHER</p>	<p>ORAL SEX (MOUTH ON PENIS OR VAGINA)</p>	<p>VAGINAL SEX (PENIS IN VAGINA)</p> <p>MOUTH ON ANUS (ORAL-ANAL SEX)</p> <p>"RIMMING"</p>	<p>ANAL SEX (PENIS IN ANUS)</p>
